- Berkeley Lab K-12 STEM Education and Outreach



Berkeley Lab Director's Apprenticeship Program (BLDAP) aims to remove systemic barriers in STEM by providing connections to the science community at Berkeley Lab. BLDAP is a paid project-based STEM apprenticeship program providing an opportunity for students to develop research skills, receive career advice, and develop a professional network.

Eligibility: Rising Juniors and Seniors in Alameda, San Francisco, and West Contra Costa counties
Program Dates: 5 weeks from June 28, 2021 to July 30, 2021



SAGE Summer Camp is a free week-long camp for public high school students to learn about the everyday life of STEM professionals. National lab scientists and engineers host career talks, small projects, job shadowing, and professional development to foster innovation in intelligent, creative, and passionate young women.

Eligibility: Rising Sophomores, Juniors, and Seniors enrolled in a NorthernCA public school; under 18 by August 6, 2021

Program Dates: 1 week from August 1 to August 7, 2021



Experiences in Research paid summer internships are for high school students with some experience in independent work. Students will work directly alongside STEM and STEM-adjacent professionals on cutting edge projects in experimental research, administration, science communication, and/or data science.

Eligibility: Rising Juniors and Seniors enrolled in CTE Pathways in West Contra Costa or Oakland

Program Dates: 6 weeks from June 21, 2021 to July 30, 2021
