

Phoebe Apperson Hearst: A Life of Power and Politics

In *Phoebe Apperson Hearst: A Life of Power and Politics* Alexandra Nickliss offers the first biography of one of the Gilded Age's most prominent and powerful women. A financial manager, businesswoman, and reformer, Phoebe Apperson Hearst was one of the wealthiest and most influential women of the era and a philanthropist, almost without rival, in the San Francisco Bay Area.

As the first woman Regent of the University of California, Hearst played the leading role in the development of the Master Plan for the Berkeley Campus and worked closely with Architects John Galen Howard and Julia Morgan in the design and placement of campus buildings. As a former school teacher she believed passionately in higher education for women and creatively supported both women students and faculty.
